Klaus Pringsheim's life has led him through four different cultures and endless assignments. Grew up in Berlin as the twin brother of Katia Mann & the son of the composer Klaus Pringsheim. He followed his father at the age of fifteen since 1939 to Tokio where his father was engaged Emperor's Music Academy. There he learned Japanese - was later accused of being a spy - landed in jail and came close to death.

In 1946 he immigrated to California and lived a number of years with Thomas Mann & family. The famous author from Germany. He took up miserable kinds of work as taxi driver, vacuum representative - Then during that period studies Japanese and Chinese politics in New York & Hong Kong where he married - continued to research political science and became a Professor of Poly Sci. Today he lives in Ottawa. political science
