Dear Mr. Placid:

I came home last thursday (Sept. 5.), and heard that you removed your residence already. Are your new house well to dwell? I am thinking that your new residence too remote to go your school of Ueno.

Four days before I meet Mr. Nagasawa, student of your Academy. He talked me that he find good house for you. I inform you those situations of this house. If you will remove to this house again, please letter me or come to me as well as soon. I will see to it.

1) The Place of this house is in TAKINOKAWA-KU, TABATAMACH, 490-BANCHI, and ~~its member~~ it mastered by Mrs. Ogawa, a widow.

2) The family of Mrs. Ogawa is high classe of it, and members are only tow person, mother and her daughter. The daughter is beautiful girl and 21 years old. She can speak English very well. Moreover, she can teach you good Japanese language and "Technics of Musik" in Japanese speaking by no charge of that teaching.

3) Her house being furnish best piano priced ¥.1500. And you can freely play on this piano if you pay about 10 yen for a month as charge of Piano.

4) If you will remove to this house again, you will take silent and beautiful room of 8-Jō. The room of 8-Jō enough to dwell to tow person. The room very adequate for Artist like you. The charge of this room about 10 yen or less for a month.

5) The boarding is very good, and Boarding is 20 yen to a person for a month.

6) The distance from this house to your school is short, only 14 minutes are need by car, straight by Yamate-Line, (nothing exchange line).
