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#### NOTES

#### 1. Presentation of the themes:

Each theme will be presented in the following form:

- a) round-table discussion by a panel of experts preceded by a short introductory expose by one of the group;
  - b) open debates.

Contributions by Members of the panel will be illustrated either by artists who will be taking part in the conference or by sound recordings.

### 2. Preservation and appreciation of music belonging to a particular civilization in Orient and Occident:

Independently of fixed sessions, a special working committee will be set up with a view to preparing resolutions on the preservation of Oriental and African music.

Particular attention will be given to the use of audio-visual aids in this connection.

#### 3. "Semaines Musicales de Paris":

This event is being organized from 12th October to 18th November 1958, by the International Music Council in co-operation with the members of the French Concert Managers' Association. #### 4. Administration:

a) Languages: Discussions will be held in the working languages of Unesco, which are English and French. Simultaneous interpretation will be available in these languages.

Any speaker may use his native language on condition that he makes himself responsible for supplying an interpreter in one of the two working languages.
