

Half Steps and Whole Steps


HALF STEP

From one key to the nearest key with no key in between is a HALF STEP.




WHOLE STEP

From one key to a neighbor key with one key in between is a WHOLE STEP.



How Major Scales Are Formed


The word SCALE comes from a Latin word meaning ladder. A scale has tones (like steps on a ladder) which go up and down. There are eight tones in a Major Scale. The tones are called scale degrees. The scale degrees are arranged in the pattern of whole steps (1) and half steps (½) shown below.



Scale Preparation Drills

TURNING THE THUMB UNDER

Practice these drills for turning the **thumb under**. Play the Right Hand drill first, then the Left Hand. Play each drill several times. Practice slowly at first.



CROSSING OVER THE THUMB

Practice these drills for crossing over the thumb. Play the Right Hand drill first, then the Left Hand. Play each drill several times. Practice slowly at first.




6ths

An interval of a sixth is written on the staff as a line note to a space note, or as a space note to a line note.



To play an interval of a 6th you must stretch fingers 1 and 5 apart.







ANTONIN DVOŘÁK (1841 - 1904)

Dvořák is a famous Czech composer. He was the son of a butcher and innkeeper. In 1892, when he was world famous, he came to America where he lived and worked for three years. Here he wrote his famous *New World Symphony* (Symphony No. 9). The melody below is from that symphony.



I V7 Chords

You have already played melodies harmonized in the following manner:



The two-note V7 chord has been used in preparation for the three-note V7 chord.

A fuller sounding V7 chord is made from three notes:



In this book the V7 chord will be played with three notes.

To play the three-note V7 chord with your Left Hand, begin with a I chord position, then:

Keep 1 the same.

Play 2 (in the five finger position).

Move 5 DOWN a HALF STEP (the nearest key down, black or white).

Practice this Left Hand chord progression in C Major until you can play it smoothly. Play by "feel." Do not look at your hand for the chord changes.




The Roman Numerals (below the chords) tell the degree of the scale on which the chord is built. The Chord Symbols (letter names above the chords) tell the name of the chord.




MOVING THE THUMB DOWN

Often it is necessary to move your thumb down to play melodies out of the five finger position. Practice the following exercises as preparation for melodies of this type.




The IV Chord

The IV chord has three notes, just like the I chord and the V7 chords. By learning this new chord, you will be able to harmonize many melodies.

To play the IV chord with your Left Hand, begin with a I chord position, then:

Keep 5 the same. Play 2 (in the five finger position). Move 1 UP a WHOLE STEP.

Practice this Left Hand chord progression in C Major until you can play it smoothly. Play by "feel." Do not look at your hand for the chord changes.



Primary Chords


All chords are built on scale tones. Chords built on the first, fourth and fifth degrees of the scale are called PRIMARY CHORDS.



Each of the Primary Chords has a name. The I chord is called the TONIC CHORD. The IV chord is called the SUBDOMINANT CHORD. The V₇ chord is called the DOMINANT SEVENTH CHORD.




MOVING THE LITTLE FINGER UP

LEGER LINES

LEGER LINES are short lines that are added above and below the staff. The staff is extended (stretched) by adding these lines. Notes are written on these lines and spaces.







6 Time Signature

All time signatures have two numbers. The upper number tells how many beats there are in a measure. The lower number tells the kind of note that gets one beat.










A GRACE NOTE is printed in small type. The small grace note is not counted in the rhythm but is played almost together with the next note. A grace note is played quickly.




The Order of Sharps

The SHARPS are always written in the same order on the staff. Memorize this order.

Major Sharp Key Signatures

The KEY SIGNATURE at the beginning of each staff tells you:

- 1. the notes to play sharped (or flatted) throughout the piece
- 2. the main tonality, or key of the piece.

RULES FOR FINDING SHARP KEY SIGNATURES

1. name the *last* sharp to the right then,



2. name the *next* letter in the musical alphabet (go UP a half step). This is the name of the **Major key**.




The GROUP 2 KEYS (D, A, E) have a black key under the middle finger and white keys on either side in their I or tonic chords. E is underlined because it is the unusual key in this group. The five finger position in E has two black keys under the 2nd and 3rd fingers in the Right Hand, and under the 3rd and 4th fingers in the Left Hand.




LUDWIG VAN BEETHOVEN (1770 - 1827)

Beethoven is one of Germany's most famous composers. He wrote many works for the piano and many symphonies. He worked hard at composing all during his lifetime. Although Beethoven became deaf during his later years, he wrote some of his finest music during his period of deafness. The Ninth Symphony is one of Beethoven's best known works written during his later years.

WOLFGANG AMADEUS MOZART (1756 - 1791)

Mozart is one of the world's greatest composers. His musical talent showed itself at a very early age. At the age of five he was composing minuets; at six, he was composing concertos; and, at nineteen, he composed his first opera.

Mozart and his sister Nannerl made concert tours of Europe. They played for kings and queens in Royal Courts. He wrote beautiful music which is enjoyed by people all over the world today.








Minor Chords

To form a minor chord (or a minor five finger position), begin with a Major chord and move your middle finger down to the nearest key (a half step). The nearest key may be either black or white.




PETER ILYITCH TCHAIKOVSKY (1840 - 1893)

Tchaikovsky is one of Russia's most famous composers. He studied law for a brief period, but he gave up this career and became a composition student under Anton Rubinstein at the St. Petersburg Conservatory.


Tchaikovsky's world famous works include the ballets Swan Lake, The Sleeping Beauty, and The Nutcracker; the Piano Concerto Number 1; and many symphonies. His March Slav is a fine example of music in a minor key.
